Kolkata (Calcutta)

Kolkata, formerly known as **Calcutta** sprawls along the eastern bank of the **Hooghly River**, a tributary of the **Ganges**. With an extended metropolitan population of over fourteen million people, it is **India's** third-largest city..

Kolkata was the birthplace of modern **Indian** literary and artistic thought. The city has inspired many with its soul and vibrancy. **Kolkata** is noted for its revolutionary history, ranging from the **Indian** struggle for independence to the leftist and trade union movements. As a "city of furious creative energy", **Kolkata** continues to spawn generations of poets, writers, film producers and **Nobel Peace Prize** winners.

Kolkata (Calcutta)

The famous **Howrah Bridge** (1943) is one of three bridges that span the **Hooghly River**. You can explore the curious flower markets by the riverside with a gentle walk.

As the former capital of **British India**, **Kolkata** is dotted with colonial buildings, including many crumbling **British Raj**-era gems. **Kolkata's** most famous landmark, **The Victoria Memorial**, is a splendid white marble monument. Established in 1814, the **Indian Museum** is the oldest museum in **Asia** and houses a vast collection of **Indian** natural history and **Indian Art**. The **National Library Of India** is the country's leading public library.

The huge, lush, green, open parkland known as the **Maidan** leads to **Eden Gardens**, one of the most famous cricket stadiums in the world.

Darjeeling

Darjeeling is one of the most beautiful **Hill Stations** in **India**. It grew in prominence during the mid 19th century when **The Darjeeling Himalayan Railway** was opened in 1881 and the town became the de-facto summer capital of **India** during the days when the **Raj** was governed from **Calcutta**.

The beautiful views of **Kanchenjunga**, the world's third tallest mountain peak (28 169ft) are a major attraction of **Darjeeling**. **Kanchenjunga** is best seen at dawn from **Tiger Hill**. It is best to visit early morning when the first rays of sun kiss the mountain and give it a golden color.

There is also much of interest in the cultural diversity of **Darjeeling**, with **Tibetans** (many **Tibetan** refugees moved here after **Tibet** was annexed by **China**), as well as **Nepali** and **Bihari** laborers brought to work in the tea plantations. One cannot also, miss to visit the House of **Tenzing Sherpa**, the first to conquer **Mount Everest**.

The Darjeeling Himalayan Railway – Excursions From Darjeeling Station

The steam 'Joy' train operates daily from **Darjeeling** to **Ghoom** round the famous **Batasia Loop**. A steam train also operates from **Siliguri** to '**Agony Point**' on weekends. There is also a daily '**School Train**' that leaves **Kurseong** at 06:15 arriving **Darjeeling** at 08:45. It leaves **Darjeeling** at 16:00 arriving **Kurseong** at 18:30. This is still hauled by a steam engine and is one of the last 'day to day'/ ordinary steam trains running anywhere in the world!

Day 07 – Pelling

Pelling

Pelling is a laid back, scenic, but rapidly swelling hamlet is situated at an altitude of 6,800 ft, above sea level. **Pelling** is famous for the magnificent view of the snow-capped mountains of the **Kanchenjunga** range. High above the forest covered hills, in an amphitheatre of cloud, snow and rock, the entire route from **Yuksam** over **Dzongri La** to the **Rathong Glacier** can be seen.

Day 08 – Day 09 Gangtok**Rumtek Monastery****Gangtok**

Gangtok is a bustling hill station, and the capital of the **Himalayan** state of **Sikkim** reflected in its picturesque setting in the **Himalayan** foothills.

There are beautiful views of the surrounding hills from **Enchey Monastery** and **Ganesh Tok**, both high above the town. **Enchey Monastery** is a two hundred year old monastery in the **Nyingma** tradition of **Tibetan Buddhism**. **Rumtek Monastery**, located 22 km from the town is one of the most important **Tibetan Buddhist** monasteries, and head seat of the **Karma Kagyu** school in **Sikkim**.

Kalimpong

Kalimpong is a **Hill Station** nestled in the **Shiwalik Hills (Lower Himalaya)** with a temperate climate and famous flower markets, especially the wide array of orchids. There are flower nurseries involved in exporting the **Himalayan** grown flower bulbs, tubers and rhizomes. It also houses several **Buddhist** monasteries which hold a number of rare **Tibetan Buddhist** scriptures.

Deolo Hill is a must see for all nature lovers. There is a lovely view from a park on the top, surrounded on all sides by tea gardens going thousands of feet deep, and the entire picturesque landscape guarded well on all sides by high rise mountains.
